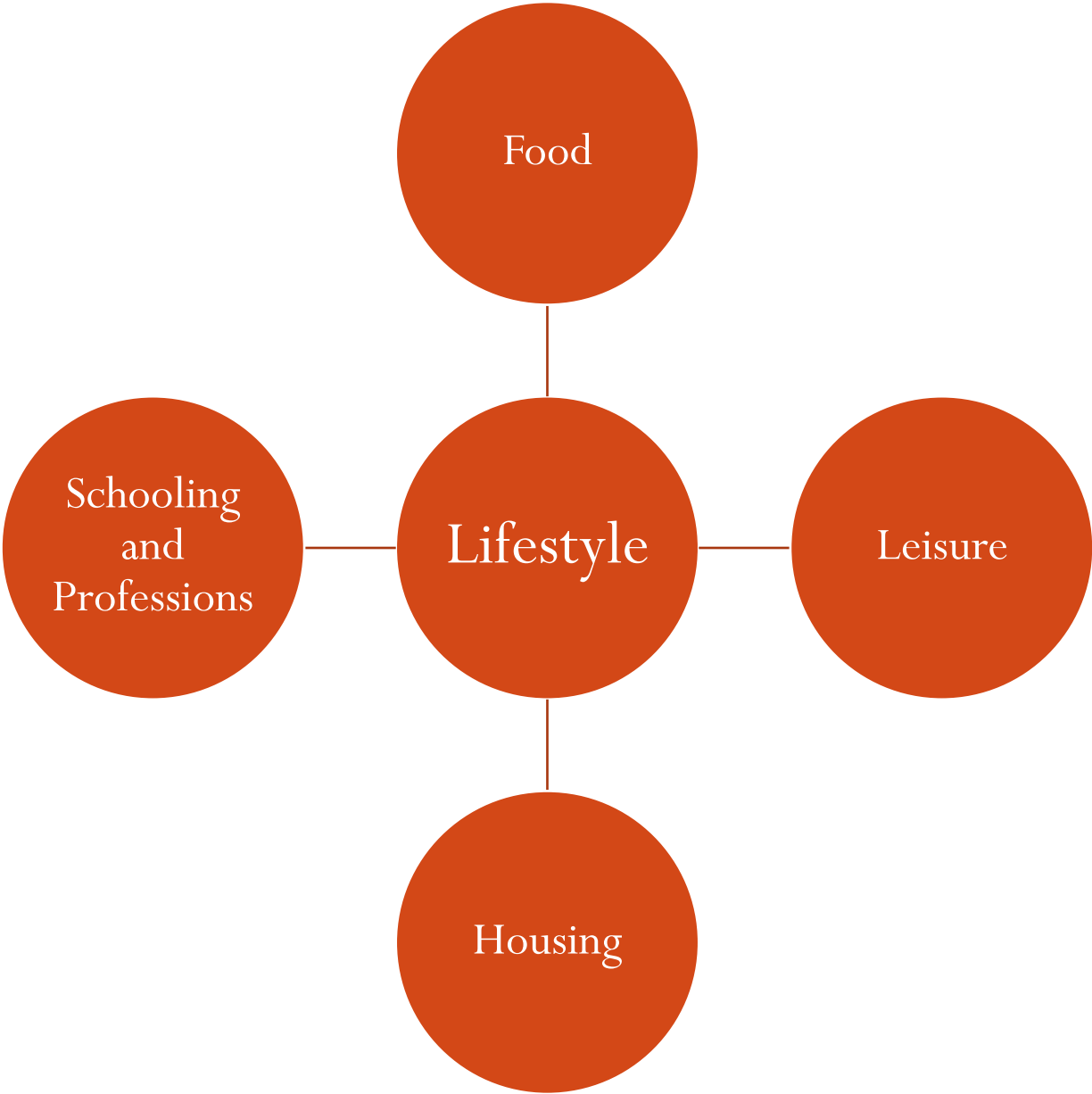

# Food

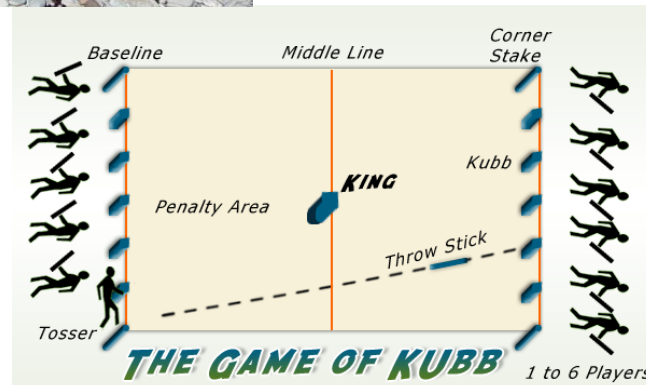
- As compared to Indian food, less amount of spices.
