

The DSK Workshop

At 8am on Saturday August 1st, select students from 11th and 12th standard left for a workshop that was to be conducted at DSK Supinfocom International Campus (DSKIC). The campus looked like it belonged to some other country! It was a sprawling 20 acre campus that was carpeted with lush green grass and dotted with palm trees. Every few feet there were abstract 3D structures that had been created by the students.

At first it was a bit awkward, but then we warmed up to each other and then the ideas started coming hard and fast. It was unbelievable to see what we all could do if we put our minds to it! All the products were very original and the best group got a prize from the college.

All too soon it was time to say goodbye to DSKIC. It was a great learning experience and with the memories fresh in our minds, we set off for TOS, hoping to visit DSK again sometime soon.
