Students of Class VIII Ameythst, Mauve and Lilac had an interaction with rich cultural heritage of Pune when they visited KASBA PETH GANPATI. Pune, on 25 September 2015, once the seat of power of the Marathas, city is located on the confluence of the rivers, Mula and Mutha.

In the year 1630 AD, the queen Jijabai Bhosale arrived in Pune with her son Shivaji. Young Shivaji, who was only aged 12, was disturbed by the pathetic plight of the mavals. Shivaji vowed to liberate the mavals from the Mughals. At the same time, an idol of Lord Ganesh was found near the house of Vinayak Thakar, who used to reside close to the residence of the queen, Jijabai Bhosle. Jijabai perceived this as an auspicious moment and promptly built a temple, which is today known as the famous Shri Kasba Ganpati Mandir. Young Shivaji started building the empire of 'Swarajya' after this auspicious moment. This is now considered as "Gram Daiwat" of Pune.



This is their 123rd year of celebration !! The mandal has adopted a village in the drought hit area of Maharashtra , where they would be donating grains collected during the ten days of Ganesh Festival.
